SAWING A CHRISTMAS

CHARCUTERIE BOARD.

A fun and easy Christmas craft that results in in a nice charcuterie board.

The building instructions:

Dimensions are shown in [mm]. Scale 1:1 on A4 format

- **1.** Glue two planed boards together to make a wider, larger board. Glued wood has less tendency to warp and your charcuterie board will last longer. Use food-safe water-resistant glue.
- **2.** Print out the template on page two, and glue it to your glued board. You can use regular paper glue or wood glue.
- **3.** Saw out your cutting board, you can use a regular jigsaw, or if you have one, a bandsaw is easier. Try to cut as straight and close to the lines as possible.
- **3.** Sand your cutting board. Start with a coarser sandpaper and work your way up to at least P240 grit. Then spray it with a little water to make the wood fibers rise up. After it dries, sand it again with the same grit size you last used. This step can be repeated further if you want to go for an even smoother surface.
- **4.** Treat your junk board with food-safe oil, paraffin oil/mineral oil if you want the most natural color possible. Linseed oil also works well but tends to stain the wood slightly. You can also use cooking oils you have at home, such as rapeseed oil, olive oil or similar.
